Zimmermann Wins Italian Gold

Felicia Zimmermann became the first American to win a gold medal in World Cup foil competition (Laurel Skillman won epee gold in 1992) with her 15-10 victory over Adeline Wuillame of France at the Junior "A" in Jesi, Italy, on December 10. Zimmermann, 19, overwhelmed Hungarian Andrea Tacacs 15-4 in her first bout in the finals, then defeated Daniella Colaiacomo of Italy 15-12 to earn the right to face Wuillame, who had won the Junior "A" in Bochum, Germany, the week before. This tournament marked Zimmermann's third appearance this season in Junior World Cup finals. On November 6 she placed sixth in the Waldkirch, Germany, Junior "A," and on December 4 she defeated Anna Rybicka of Poland to reach the finals at Bochum, finishing fifth. In November, she also made the finals of the Senior "B" in Mosbach, Germany, finishing seventh out of 140 competitors, and placed in the top 32 at a Senior "A" in Athens.

Zimmermann's string of successes has elevated her to 5th place in the Junior World Cup standings, behind #1-ranked Rita Koenig of Germany, Wuillame. Rybicka, and former Senior World Champion Aida Mohamed of Hungary. Not surprisingly, she is ranked #1 in Under-20 points in the US. She is also ranked 21st in the Senior World Cup standings and is among the topranked US senior women foil fencers. Zimmermann, the 1993 USFA National Champion in Women's Foil, is a freshman at the University of Rochester in upstate New York. She is coached by Buckie Leach, Weapon Coordinator for Women's Foil, and proudly represents the Rochester Fencing Center.

Finalists in Other Weapons

Felicia Zimmermann is not the only American to reach a Junior World Cup final this season. New Yorker **Cliff Bayer** took 5th place at the Men's Foil Junior "A" in Aix-en-Provence, France, on December 4. Bayer, 17, finished 25th at the Junior "A" in Como, Italy, last spring, and just missed the finals of the 1994 World Under-20 Championships in Mexico City, finishing 11th. He is coached by Yefim Litvan at Metropolis Fencing, Inc.

Eric Hansen, a 19-year-old from San Bruno, CA, joined the ranks of US finalists on November 13, placing sixth at the Men's Epée Junior "A" in Catania, Italy. Hansen, a member of the US team at the 1994 World Under-20 Championships, represents the Halberstadt Fencers Club in San Francisco, where he is coached by Women's Epée Weapon Coordinator Paul Soter.

The fourth US finalist this season is **Jennifer Dyer**, a past member of numerous Under-17 and Under-20 US teams in both foil and épée. Dyer, who will turn 18 on New Year's Day, placed 8th at the Women's Epée Junior "A" in Frascati, Italy, over Thanksgiving weekend. A resident of Aurora, CO, she represents the Northern Colorado Fencers. Her coaches are Gary Copeland and Andrea Lagan.

A "Junior" is any competitive inember whose birthdate is 1/1/75 or later. Unless noted, events are MF, ME, MS, WF and WE.

A "Cadet" is any competitive member whose birthdate is 1/1/78 or later. Events are MF, ME, MS, WF and WE.

"Youth" comprises three categories. Under-15 is any competitive member whose birthdate is 1/1/80 or later. Events are MF, ME, MS, WF and WE. Under-13 is any competitive member whose birthdate is 1/1/82 or later. Events are MF, ME, MS, WF and WE. Under-11 is any competitive member whose hirthdate is 1/1/84 or later. Events are MF and WF.

Other Events

Open: Any competitive member whose birthdate is before 1/1/84 may compete by submitting a timely entry. Unless noted, events are MF, ME, MS, WF and WE. Division II: Any competitive member with a rating of "C" or under and whose birthdate is before 1/1/84 may compete by submitting a timely entry. Events are MF, ME, MS, WF, WE & WS. Division III: Any competitive member with a rating of "D" or under and whose birthdate is before 1/1/84 may compete by submitting a timely entry. Events are MF, ME, MS, WF, WE & WS.

Entry Fees

Summary of 12/20/94 Executive Committee Teleconference

Action Items

- 1. Approved the Minutes of the 9/30/94 meeting.
- 2. In response to a recent clarification from the FIE, rescinded the changes to Articles 209 and 309 of the USFA Rules for Competition concerning prohibition of the use of an attachment device interfering with the flexing of the wrist. Background: These changes were approved at the 8/7/93 EC meeting and subsequently by the Board at the 10/2/93 Annual meeting. The USFA rule change was based on a specific rule change listed in a document distributed by the FIE at the Essen World Championships and identified as a summary of the actions of the 1993 FIE Congress. A subsequent document released by the FIE following the fall FIE EC meeting did not list this rule change, but neither did it state that the previously printed rule was not in effect.

The USFA recently received written confirmation from FIE President Roch that the above rule was in fact *not* passed by the 1993 FIE Congress. Therefore, the FOC Chair requested that the EC rescind the rule change that had previously been approved.

- 3. Extended the policy currently in effect restricting participation in certain national events to fencers at least 11 years of age before January 1 of the fencing season to include the newlycreated Division II and Division III NAC events. Competitors must reach their 11th birthday before 1/1/95 to be eligible to compete in Open NACs, Division II or III NACs, Division I or II National Championships, or non-age group National Team Championships in the 1994-95 fencing season. There is no minimum age restriction for age group (e.g. U20, U19, U17, etc.) NACs or National Championships, or for the U19 team events at the National Championships.
- 4. Created a Point Standings Task Force to investigate proposals for the creation of a new system for maintaining the USFA point standings, which have become too complex for the current system. Members of the Task Force are: Ann Ezzell (Chair), Irwin Bernstein, James Carpenter, George Masin, and Selden Fritschner (Staff Liaison).
- 5. Created an Olympic Festival Task Force to determine policies concerning the objectives of the Festival and how it should be structured to meet those objectives, as well as to improve communication to athletes, coaches and other participants. Members of the Task Force are: Michael Massik (Chair), Gerrie Baumgart, Terrence Gargiulo, Susie Paxton, Bob Largman, Buckie Leach, William Goering (Officer Liaison) and Selden Fritschner (Staff Liaison). An initial budget of \$500 was allotted, to be taken from the President's discretionary fund if necessary.
- 6. Upon the recommendation of Vice President William Goering, who has been working with the account representative for the USFA's insurance agency, agreed not to renew the insurance coverage on the USFA-owned scoring equipment and strips that are stored in Colorado Springs. The equipment is slated to be sold, and the premium of \$866 for one year would be due 1/1/95.
- 7. Agreed to increase the USFA's property insurance (comprehensive fire and theft) from \$25,000 to \$40,000 (at an estimated cost of \$200 per year) because of the increase in the amount of merchandise stored at the Headquarters.

 Voted to delay implementation of the requirement for FIEapproved (i.e., bearing an official FIE label) uniforms at certain USFA selection events and the Olympic Festival until 10/1/95.

Note: The rule requiring a regulation plastron with *any* uniform, effective 3/1/95, remains in effect for all USFA competitions, regardless of level.

Background: This decision was made in response to feedback from coaches and fencers who will be affected by the requirement. Opposition has been expressed to changing the rules in the middle of the fencing season, and there also appears to have been some confusion as to the exact intent of the Board (full 800 Newton uniforms versus 800/350 Newton uniforms).

Explanation concerning names on uniforms

The fencer's last name must be legibly printed in dark blue capital letters not more than 10 cm high: either on the back of the uniform or lamé between the shoulders; or \gg on the front or side of the thigh of the "rear" leg; or \circledast on a piece of fabric or lamé material that is firmly sewn to the uniform in such a way that it will not detach during fencing or catch the opponent's point. Fabric attached to the uniform must be the same color as the part of the uniform to which it is attached. *Names printed on tape are NOT acceptable.*

Cadet and Youth NAC #2 - December 2-4, Carrollton, GA

With over 600 entries in 17 events, the Cadet and Youth NAC #2 demonstrated the growth of fencing in the US. The USFA's top fencers, aged 17 and under, proved themselves to be real competitors with impressive performances in every event.

The Bionic Fencer Award for

this event goes to 12-year-old Andrea Ament from Gates Mills, OH, who advanced to the finals in five out of the six events she entered. Ament, who represents the Alcazar Fencing Club in Cleveland, won the gold medal in the U13 Women's Epće, the silver in the U13 Women's Foil and the bronze in the U17 Women's Epće. She also placed seventb in the U17 Women's Foil and the U15 Women's Epée, and just missed the final eight in U15 Women's Foil, finishing 11th. Several other fencers also excelled in more than one event, as can be seen from the top eight results for each of the events. Look for these and our other fine young athletes at the 1995 Junior Olympic Championships in San Jose. CA.

Equipment Requirements

Please note the following changes to the USFA rules concerning fencing equipment (for more information, see the summary of the Executive Committee teleconference, above left).

FIE-approved uniforms

Implementation of the requirement for FIE-approved uniforms at USFA selection events and the Olympic Festival has been *postponed* until 10/1/95. Please note, however, that the requirement for a regulation plastron (underarm protector) with *any* uniform will go into effect *for all USFA competitions* as of 3/1/95.

Bib as target in foil

The FIE has delayed implementation of this rule until the 1995-96 fencing season. (It was not slated for adoption at USFA competitions.)

Wrist strap

We have received official ruling from the FIE that a previouslyannounced FIE rule change prohibiting the use of a wrist strap with an Italian grip was in fact not passed by the Congress. Therefore, the relevant USFA rule change has been rescinded.

Note: A comprehensive article about fencing equipment requirements and safety issues is planned for the next issue of *American Fencing* magazine.

USFA World Cup Notes

Men's Sabre

The 1995 US Men's Sabre World Cup will be held at the New York Athletic Club in New York City. The prelimary rounds for the individual event are currently scheduled for Friday afternoon, March 24. The individual event will continue Saturday, March 25. A World Cup Team event is scheduled for Sunday, March 26. (*Note:* The schedule is subject to change.)

Women's Foil

The 1995 US Women's Foil World Cup will take place in Atlanta, GA, from May 12 to 14. The schedule of events will be similar to that for the Men's Sabre World Cup. Finalization of the site is expected by January 10.

New USFA Sponsors

Executive Director Selden Fritschner recently signed two new USFA sponsors: Coca-Cola and the Atlanta Centennial Organizing Group (ACOG). Coca-Cola will provide promotional assistance and various Coke products (Coke, Sprite, Diet Coke, Poweraide, juices, cups and coolers) at major USFA events. They will also offer public relations support and in-store sales for tickets for selected events.

The 1995 and 1996 Women's Foil World Cup events have been approved as pre-Olympic events by ACOG and will receive financial support as a result..

Under-19 Teams

Divisions are reminded that they must hold qualifying events for the Under-19 Team competitions that will be demonstration events at the 1995 National Championships. Under-19 Teams will compete in all six weapons: Men's and Women's Foil, Epée and Sabre. The qualification process is the same as that for the National Team Championship events (see Chapter V, Section 9 of the Operations Manual for details), except that there is no minimum age requirement.

The format for the demonstration events will be the same as that used in the National Team Championships: FIE relay teams of three fencers plus a substitute. (A description of the FIE relay team format was printed in the last issue of the National Newletter.) Under-19 Team events will be held at the Nationals only if at least six teams are properly entered for that weapon.

USFA Rules Book

The long-awaited update to the USFA Rules for Competition should be available at a nominal cost from the National Headquarters by the time you read this. The update pages list all changes to the Rules since the 1991 printing (copies of the 1991 edition may be purchased from the National Headquarters and many fencing equipment suppliers). The text of the update will also be posted on the Internet; check your favorite ftp site or WWW page, or send an e-mail request to amcbain@aol.com.

A complete reprint of the *Rules* is in the works and should be completed by June 1. The USFA *Rules for Competition*, *Operations Manual* and Bylaws will also be available on the Internet and possibly on disk.

Division II and Division III North American Cup Northwestern University – Evanston, IL March 10-12, 1995

Would you like to earn a higher rating? Are you a referee who would like the opportunity to work at a national event under the guidance of highly-rated referees? Are you interested in improving your skills on the Bout Committee and in being included in the pool of talent for National USFA tournaments? Would you like to become a member of the national technical group of armourers? If your answer is "yes," come to the Division II and Division III North American Cup in March. This new event is designed not only to promote competition and competitive development for fencers rated C or below, but also to provide a means for talented persons to raise their level of competency as referees and bout committee and technical personnel. The 1995 Division II and Division III NAC will be held March 10-12 at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. It is expected that the success of these tournaments will result in their becoming a regular part of the USFA National Calendar. Both Division II ("C" and under) and Division III ("D" and under) competitions will feature men's and women's foil, épée and sabre. The schedule of events is shown on the entry form printed elsewhere in this newsletter. (*Note:* Fencers will be able to work on developing their tournament skills on days when they are not competing.)

Group II-A and Group III-A Competition Categories

As an added bonus, the Division II and III NAC events will provide a greater opportunity to earn classifications. Two new competition categories were approved by the Board of Directors at its 1994 Annual Meeting. Division II NACs will automatically be Group II-A competitions, and Division III NACs will be Group III-A competitions. (Divisional and Sectional events meeting the criteria listed in the last National Newsletter can also be Group II-A or Group III-A competitions.)
